

- a. Ordinances and Public Hearings pursuant to Article 6, Section 6.01 E of the Plaquemines Parish Charter:
 1. An Ordinance adopting updates and amendments to Port Tariff and Security fee rates for Plaquemines Port Harbor & Terminal District (the Port) to be added to the Port's approved Financial Policies and Procedures; and otherwise, to provide with respect thereto. (DEFERRED & CARRIED OVER FROM 4-9-26) COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

Digest: At the Gulf SeaPorts Marine Terminal Conference convened on November 6, 2025, a proposal for 2025-2026 security fees was presented. *The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.*

2. An Ordinance to amend and to initiate the collection of the Plaquemines Parish Port, Harbor & Terminal District Harbor Fees (Supplemental Harbor Fees); and otherwise to provide with respect thereto. COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

DIGEST: The Port seeks to amend and initiate the collection of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District Harbor Fees (Supplemental Harbor Fees). The digest is for informational purposes only superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.

- b. An Ordinance establishing the policy of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor, and Terminal District in regard to its records; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto. (DEFERRED & CARRIED OVER FROM 3-12-26, 3-26-26, 4-9-26) COMMISSIONER MCCARTY

DIGEST: To establish a policy that the members of the Parish Council, in their role as the governing authority of the Port, may access Port records without the need for a formal public records request. *The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.*

- c. A Resolution authorizing the Plaquemines Parish Port, Harbor & Terminal District to enter into agreements with Enterprise FM Trust and Enterprise Fleet Management Inc. for the

acquisition, maintenance, management, disposal, and financing of Port fleet vehicles, and otherwise providing with respect thereto. (DEFERRED & CARRIED OVER FROM 3-26-26, 4-9-26) COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

DIGEST: This Resolution authorizes the Port to enter into a comprehensive set of contracts with Enterprise Fleet Management (EFM) and Enterprise FM Trust to modernize, maintain, finance, and remarket (sell) the Port's vehicle fleet. Together, these agreements support a fully integrated lifecycle fleet management program covering: acquisition of vehicles, leasing structure and financial terms, full maintenance and repair management, short-term rental support, fleet disposal via consignment auction, and credit and ach authorization to facilitate billing. *The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.*

- d. A Resolution directing the engagement of an independent governance and technology firm to review and advise as to governance processes and supporting technology systems; and otherwise to provide respect thereto. (DEFERRED & CARRIED OVER FROM 4-9-26) COMMISSIONER MCCARTY

DIGEST: To direct the engagement of a firm to advise the Port on governance processes and supporting technology systems. *The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.*

- e. An Ordinance approving Amendment No. 2 to the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement among Jefferson Parish, City of Gretna, and Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District regarding pre-application activities needed to solicit federal funding for the Westbank Rail Realignment project; and further providing for approval of said amendment by the Plaquemines Parish Council as the governing authority of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto. (DEFERRED & CARRIED OVER FROM 4-9-26) COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

DIGEST: This ordinance approves Amendment No. 2 to the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement entered into by Jefferson Parish (PARISH), City of Gretna (CITY), and Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District (PPHTD) for pre-application activities related to securing federal funding for the West Bank Rail Realignment Project. Amendment No. 2 increases the total maximum funding by \$2,097,775, raising the overall cap from \$4,000,000 to \$6,097,775, to address existing obligations and additional required services. The amendment increases the maximum financial participation of both Jefferson Parish and PPHTD to \$2,286,665 each and increases the City of Gretna's maximum contribution to \$1,524,445, consistent with the previously approved cost-sharing percentages. This ordinance seeks and authorizes approval of Amendment No. 2 by the Plaquemines Parish Council acting as the governing authority of PPHTD and authorizes execution of all necessary documents to implement the amendment. *The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual Ordinance.*

- f. A Resolution authorizing the offer of appointment to _____ as the Chief Operating Officer of the Plaquemines Port, Harbor & Terminal District; and otherwise to provide with respect thereto. COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

- g. An Ordinance to amend the 2026 Manpower Structure and Operating Expenditure Budget; and otherwise, to provide with respect thereto. COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

DIGEST: An Ordinance to amend the Port, Harbor, and Terminal District (Port) 2026 Manpower Structure and Operating Expenditure Budget to create a Director of Information Technology position by appropriating \$XXXXXX to fund the said position. The funding source is the unrestricted fund balance. The digest is for informational purposes only and is superseded by the language of the actual ordinance or resolution.

- h. An Ordinance authorizing Lloyd "Ronnie" Newsom, Board Chairman, to continue a Navy Business Case Analysis and amend the 2026 Five-Year Capital Improvements Budget, to appropriate funding for the integrated Phase II and III of the Project; and otherwise, to provide with respect thereto. COMMISSIONER NEWSOM

DIGEST: A Navy Business Case Analysis is needed to continue the growth of the Port and will include an update every five years. This will be a guide to aid Legislators to evaluate the value of these projects as they relate to the State's priorities. Phase I of the Analysis was completed January 13, 2026, and presented to stakeholders. Following positive support from key stakeholders Phases II and III are scheduled to commence.
